Las Vegas City Stay

Las Vegas has a fascinating history, transforming from a desert outpost into one of the world's most famous cities. Its name, meaning "the meadows" in Spanish, was given in the 1820s by explorers who found natural springs in the valley. Officially founded in 1905, Las Vegas began as a small railroad town before booming in the 1930s with the construction of the Hoover Dam, which brought workers, electricity, and growth. In 1931,

Nevada legalized gambling, laying the foundation for the casinos and entertainment that would define the city. The 1940s and 1950s saw the rise of glamorous resorts and legendary performers, while organised crime played a role in early casino development. Over time, Las Vegas reinvented itself into a global hub for luxury, entertainment, and tourism. Today, it is renowned not only for gaming but also for spectacular shows, fine dining, and world-class attractions, drawing millions of visitors annually.

USA National Parks

America's national parks are more than breathtaking landscapes—they are living legacies of conservation, cultural heritage, and human history. This tour offers a unique journey through some of the country's most iconic parks, highlighting not just their natural beauty, but the stories behind their creation, preservation, and ongoing significance.

Grand Canyon National Park, established as a national park in 1919, is one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World. Its awe-inspiring vistas tell a story of geological processes spanning billions of years, yet the park's history is also deeply entwined with the Native American tribes who have called this land home for centuries, including the Hopi, Navajo, and Havasupai peoples. The canyon's protected status ensures that these sacred lands, rich in cultural heritage and ancient dwellings, are preserved for future generations.


Monument Valley Navajo Tribal Park, while not a federally designated national park, has become an iconic symbol of the American West. The valley is managed by the Navajo Nation, and its dramatic sandstone buttes have been central to Navajo culture for generations. Monument Valley's preservation

reflects the importance of indigenous stewardship, ensuring that its cultural narratives, traditions, and sacred sites remain respected while sharing the landscape with the world.

Arches National Park in Utah, established in 1971, showcases over 2,000 natural sandstone arches, formed through millions of years of erosion. Its protection arose from early conservation efforts recognizing the fragility of these geological formations. Nearby Colorado National Monument, established in 1911, similarly reflects the early 20th-century movement to conserve striking desert landscapes for public enjoyment and scientific study.

Custer State Park, created in 1897, is America's second-largest state park and exemplifies the early conservation ethos that sought to protect both wildlife and landscapes. The park is home to bison herds, pronghorn, and elk, preserving species that were once threatened by overhunting and settlement. Nearby monuments such as Mount Rushmore and the Crazy Horse Memorial tie the natural landscape to the history of westward expansion, the pioneer spirit, and the rich traditions of Native American communities.





Yellowstone National Park, established in 1872 as the world's first national park, represents a milestone in global conservation. President Ulysses S. Grant recognized the need to preserve the region's geothermal features, wildlife, and vast wilderness for public enjoyment. Yellowstone's geysers, hot springs, and bison herds inspired the creation of the national park movement worldwide, demonstrating the value of protecting natural wonders for education, science, and recreation.

Grand Teton National Park, established in 1929, protects the jagged peaks and glacial lakes of the Teton Range, reflecting both natural grandeur and a history of advocacy for conservation. These protected lands tell the story of early explorers, settlers, and conservationists whose efforts preserved the region's landscapes amidst increasing development pressures.

Bryce Canyon National Park and Zion National Park, established in the early 20th century, further highlight the role of visionary conservationists. Bryce's unique hoodoos and Zion's towering cliffs were preserved not just for their beauty but for their scientific and recreational value.

Both parks illustrate the balance between allowing public enjoyment and maintaining fragile ecosystems, a challenge that continues to guide the National Park Service today.

Salt Lake City, the gateway to Bryce and Zion, itself reflects the intertwining of human history with natural landscapes. Founded by Mormon pioneers in 1847, the city's development mirrors the broader American story of settlement, industry, and respect for the surrounding natural environment.

Across this journey, the national parks are united not only by their natural grandeur but by their shared history of conservation, cultural significance, and inspiration. Each park preserves stories of the people, wildlife, and landscapes that define America's heritage, allowing visitors to connect with both nature and history. Exploring these parks is a reminder of the foresight of early conservationists and the ongoing responsibility to protect these treasures for future generations, ensuring that the history, culture, and natural beauty of America's national parks remain vibrant and accessible to all.

Day 1. Monday 17 August 2026 HOME PORT – LAS VEGAS

Let's begin our journey as we depart our home port and board our flight to Las Vegas via Los Angeles. Our Tour Host will travel from Mackay and meet us either at Mackay Airport or in transit.

This evening we will arrive in Las Vegas and transfer to our accommodation for an evening at leisure.

Day 2. Tuesday 18 August 2026 LAS VEGAS | B D

This morning enjoy a leisurely breakfast as you wake up in Sin City, Las Vegas! Today you will have the opportunity to explore the city at your leisure, or why not take the chance to explore on a day tour. Your Tour Host can assist in arranging your options to fill an exciting day in Las Vegas or surrounds.

This evening we will meet for a welcome drink where we will meet our Tour Manager from the Globus Family, along with other travellers that will join us on our National Parks Tour. We will be joining a small group guided tour with Globus, with a maximum group size of 28 guests on board.

Tonight we will explore the Las Vegas strip on an exciting private Hosted Journeys tour before we enjoy a special welcome dinner hosted by your Hosted Journeys Tour Host.

Day 3. Wednesday 19 August 2026 LAS VEGAS TO GRAND CANYON NP | B

Depart the glittering lights and glamour of Las Vegas for one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World, Grand Canyon National Park. Carved through the rocks of the Colorado Plateau over millions of years, the canyon is more than a mile deep and 10 miles wide, revealing billions of years of geological history.

Stretching 446 kilometres in length and up to 29 kilometres wide, it offers breathtaking panoramas and colourful layers of ancient rock formations. Visitors can enjoy spectacular viewpoints along the South Rim, including Mather Point and

Desert View, each offering unique perspectives of the canyon's vast expanse. For those seeking adventure, walking trails such as the Rim Trail or Bright Angel Trail provide unforgettable experiences. The park is also rich in history and culture, with ties to Native American tribes who have lived in the region for centuries. Whether marvelling at sunrise or sunset, exploring on foot, or simply taking in the grandeur, the Grand Canyon promises an unforgettable highlight of any journey.

Tonight, savor a sunset in one of the most beautiful places in the world.

Day 4. Thursday 20 August 2026 GRAND CANYON NP TO MONUMENT VALLEY | B D

This morning, we have the opportunity to join an exciting helicopter flight over the canyon (additional cost) or enjoy a hike on one of the trails.

Afterwards, we travel north through Arizona and into the Navajo Nation to Monument Valley Navajo Tribal Park for a 4-wheel-drive backcountry adventure. Our local Navajo guide will show us some of the valley's most incredible scenery.

Travelling through Monument Valley is like stepping into a living postcard of the American Southwest. This iconic landscape, straddling the Arizona-Utah border, is famous for its towering sandstone buttes, wide-open plains, and dramatic desert vistas. The area holds deep cultural significance for the Navajo people, who continue to live and work in the region, sharing their traditions and stories with visitors. Sunrise and sunset cast a magical glow over the red rock formations, creating unforgettable photographic opportunities. Experiencing Monument Valley offers a perfect blend of natural beauty, cultural heritage, and timeless adventure, making it a highlight of any Southwest itinerary.

Tonight, stay at the historic Goulding's Lodge, where you will be treated to a private Navajo cookout.





Day 5. Friday 21 August 2026
MONUMENT VALLEY TO GRAND JUNCTION | B

Today, journey north through breathtaking desert landscapes to the adventure hub of Moab, a vibrant town nestled between red rock cliffs and the Colorado River. Moab is renowned for its welcoming atmosphere, boutique shops, cafés, and outdoor spirit, making it the perfect place to pause and soak up the local charm. The town is also the gateway to two of Utah's most famous national parks, Arches and Canyonlands and attracts visitors from all over the world seeking both natural beauty and adventure.

From here, continue to the extraordinary Arches National Park, a geological wonderland home to more than 2,000 natural sandstone arches, pinnacles, and rock formations. Marvel at iconic landmarks such as Balanced Rock, the soaring cliffs of Park Avenue, and the world-famous Delicate Arch, a symbol of Utah. The park's dramatic scenery, shaped by millions of years of wind and water erosion, creates a landscape unlike anywhere else on earth. Stroll along scenic viewpoints or take short walks to admire the ever-changing colors of the rock formations, which glow brilliantly in the afternoon light.

Later this afternoon, we cross into Colorado and travel to Grand Junction, the largest city on Colorado's Western Slope. Nestled in the heart of wine country and surrounded by rugged mesas, Grand Junction offers a mix of natural beauty and small-city charm. The evening is yours to relax, explore the local dining scene, or simply unwind after a day of incredible sightseeing.

Day 6. Saturday 22 August 2026 GRAND JUNCTION TO DENVER | B

This morning, visit a hidden gem, the Colorado National Monument, for sweeping views of sheer-walled canyons and the desert land of the high Colorado Plateau below.

Afterwards we will journey east across the Rocky Mountains to the "Mile High City" of Denver. This evening is free to explore the vibrant city and take advantage of the shopping, dining, paved walking trails, and entertainment.

Day 7. Sunday 23 August 2026 DENVER TO CUSTER STATE PARK | B D

Today we travel across the windswept landscape of Wyoming and into the Black Hills of South Dakota. We will spend the next two nights in beautiful Custer State Park. Formed in 1897, the park is the second-largest state park in America. Its 73,000 breathtaking acres are home to a variety of wildlife, including bison, pronghorn antelope, mountain goats, whitetail deer, bighorn sheep, mountain lions, wild burros, and elk.

The park also features scenic drives, such as the famous Wildlife Loop Road and Needles Highway, offering panoramic views of rugged granite peaks and rolling plains. Visitors can enjoy outdoor activities like hiking, fishing, and birdwatching, all set against a backdrop of stunning natural beauty. With its mix of wildlife, landscapes, and recreational opportunities, Custer State Park provides an unforgettable introduction to the heart of South Dakota.

On arrival we will settle in and enjoy dinner at a local restaurant.

Day 8. Monday 24 August 2026 MOUNT RUSHMORE & CRAZY HORSE MEMORIAL | B D

This morning, visit a shrine to democracy, Mount Rushmore National Memorial. The epic sculpture depicts the faces of four legendary American presidents who symbolize this nation's rich history, rugged determination, and lasting achievement. We then, visit the Crazy Horse Memorial, built in honor of the fearless Lakota Chief, Tasunke Witco, known as Crazy Horse, who ensured Custer's last stand at the Battle of Little Bighorn. Learn about the sculpture, his family, and the future of the project.

We then return to Custer State Park for an exciting dinner experience where we get to be a part of a Buffalo Safari with a Local Expert and enjoy a country chuckwagon cookout, complete with Western entertainment.





Day 9. Tuesday 25 August 2026 CUSTER STATE PARK TO SHERIDAN | B

Start today by exploring the Wild West town of Deadwood. Next, we enjoy a scenic drive through the Black Hills to the frontier town of Sheridan, located at the foot of the Bighorn Mountains.

Take a journey through time as you travel down cobblestone streets and hear stories of all the legendary characters that contributed to the town's history, including Wild Bill Hickok, Calamity Jane, and Potato Creek Johnny.

Day 10. Wednesday 26 August 2026 SHERIDAN TO YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK | B

Travel over the Big Horn Mountains to Yellowstone National Park, established in 1872 as the world's first national park. Spend the next two days exploring the beauty of this National treasure, spanning nearly 3,500 square miles atop a volcanic hot spot.

Designated as a national park by law 150 years ago, President Ulysses S. Grant worked to preserve and protect the wild landscapes, native heritage, spectacular wildlife, and extraordinary geologic and ecological phenomena that make this Rocky Mountain paradise a treasure today and for future generations to treasure. From glaciers and geysers to grizzlies and great bison, no one leaves the park without being changed by the natural wonder witnessed in any of its 200+acres of pristine wilderness.

Day 11. Thursday 27 August 2026 YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK | B D

Today we will spend the day exploring Yellowstone National Park, one of the most iconic parks. Explore the untamed wilderness of Yellowstone, where geothermal wonders and dramatic landscapes create a truly unique experience. See the world-famous Old Faithful Geyser, the stunning Grand Canyon of Yellowstone, and the bubbling geothermal features at Fountain Paint Pot. Be on the lookout for the park's extraordinary wildlife, including moose, bison, elk, deer, bighorn sheep, wolves, bears, foxes, coyotes, and beavers. Wander along scenic trails, hike to hidden viewpoints, or take a leisurely drive through the park's diverse ecosystems.

Day 12. Friday 28 August 2026 YELLOWSTONE NP TO JACKSON | B

Today is dedicated to exploring Grand Teton National Park. With its magnificent peaks and glacial landscapes, Grand Teton National Park draws millions of visitors each year. This Rocky Mountain marvel is the perfect pairing of natural grandeur with frontier spirit of the town of Jackson. Find serenity on the shores of gorgeous glacier-fed Jenny Lake and stroll along the shore before continuing to Jackson.

This afternoon we will continue our journey south as we make our way to Jackson for an overnight stay and some time at leisure. This evening, consider a visit to the Antler Arches, enjoy a drink at the iconic Million Dollar Cowboy Bar, or shop for the perfect cowboy hat!

Day 13. Saturday 29 August 2026 JACKSON TO SALT LAKE CITY | B D

After breakfast, we continue our journey south through the sweeping landscapes of Wyoming and into the state of Utah. By early afternoon we arrive in Salt Lake City, the state's capital and cultural heart, where we'll enjoy a guided orientation tour. Salt Lake City has a rich and fascinating history. It was founded in 1847 by Mormon pioneers led by Brigham Young, who, upon seeing the valley's striking mountains and fertile land, declared, "This is the right place." The settlement quickly grew into a thriving community, with the Mormon faith shaping much of its early development.

The iconic Salt Lake Temple and Temple Square remain at the city's centre, offering a glimpse into its spiritual and architectural heritage. Over the years, Salt Lake City developed into a hub for mining, railroads, and trade, balancing its pioneer roots with rapid modernisation.

In more recent history, the city rose to international prominence when it hosted the 2002 Winter Olympic Games. Today, Salt Lake City blends history and modern living, with a vibrant downtown home to museums, shopping, and a thriving dining scene for us to indulge in dinner at a local restaurant this evening.





Day 14. Sunday 30 August 2026 SALT LAKE CITY TO BRYCE CANYON NP | B

Today's highlight is a visit to unique Bryce Canyon National Park. We will spend time in the park capturing the magnificent contrasts of bright red, yellow, and pink pillars called "hoodoos", that resemble castle towers, cathedral spires, and squatting goblins. Years of erosion have carved colourful sandstone into thousands of spires, arches, and mazes for an unforgettable sight.

As the light changes throughout the day, the canyons glow among distinct oranges, reds, and yellows creating a striking background for photographic masterpieces. And stars? The Bryce area is one of the best places for stargazing thanks to its remote location and lack of pollution. On some nights, more than 7,500 stars are visible!

Day 15. Monday 31 August 2026 BRYCE CANYON NP TO LAS VEGAS | B L D

This morning we will depart Bryce Canyon National Park for a memorable drive on the Zion-Mount Carmel Highway and Tunnel to Zion National Park.

Enjoy scenic views of high desert landscape, soaring cliffs, narrow canyons and the Virgin River. Experience traveling through an engineering marvel, the Zion-Mount Carmel Tunnel, built in the 1920s to connect Grand Canyon, Zion and Bryce National Parks.

For lunch we will enjoy a boxed picnic on the front lawn of Zion Lodge, followed by some free time to explore. Zion Lodge is in the heart of Zion National Park, with trails beginning just steps from the front door. Guests can enjoy leisurely walks along the Virgin River close by to the Lodge.

This afternoon we will continue to Las Vegas where we will enjoy a Farewell Dinner with our fellow travellers.

Day 16. Tuesday 1 September 2026 DEPART LAS VEGAS | B

Today we will have some time to enjoy Las Vegas and do some last-minute sightseeing or shopping, perhaps visiting iconic attractions along the Strip or picking up souvenirs from world-class stores. Take the opportunity to soak in the city's vibrant energy one final time.

This afternoon we will bid farewell to the USA as we transfer to the airport and begin our journey back to Australia, reflecting on the incredible experiences, sights, and adventures of your unforgettable trip.

Day 17. Wednesday 2 September 2026 IN FLIGHT

Continue our journey in flight.

Holiday Pricing:

The package price is per person based on twin share accommodation and subject to a minimum number of passengers booked. Should minimum numbers not be met, we reserve the right to withdraw the departure prior to final payment date and a refund of your paid deposit will be offered. Alternatively the tour will proceed as planned however the Tour Host may not travel with the group. Your holiday pricing may increase if minimum numbers are not met.

Hosted Journeys reserves the right to modify program itineraries, included sightseeing and substitute accommodations and transportation at any time due to unforeseen circumstances. In such circumstances, we will do our best to supply comparable services, accommodations and itineraries, and there shall be no refund in this situation.

Currency Adjustment
